Fill your prescription at the pharmacy and read these instructions several days before the procedure.

Three days before the procedure, begin a LOW RESIDUE DIET (see low residue diet instructions)

The day before the procedure:

- 1. Do not eat anything solid. Follow the clear liquid diet instructions.
- 2. Clear liquids include water, black coffee, tea, apple juice, white grape juice, soda, Jell-O, popsicles, broth, and Gatorade or other sport drinks. DO NOT drink milk or use non-dairy creamer. DO NOT drink anything colored red or purple. DO NOT drink alcohol.
- 3. Use the mixing container to mix the contents of the <u>Dose 1 Plenvu pouches</u> with at least 16 ounces of water by shaking or using a spoon until it's completely dissolved. This may take 2 to 3 minutes. Refrigerating the prep may make it easier to drink.
- 4. At 5:00 PM begin drinking dose 1 of the prep. Take your time and slowly finish the dose within 30 minutes.
- 5. Refill the container with at least 16 ounces of clear liquid. Again, take your time and slowly finish all of it within 30 minutes. Stay close to a restroom.

The morning of the procedure:

- 1. Do not eat.
- 2. Mix dose 2 as before. (See above.)
- 3. <u>Begin drinking dose 2 at least four hours before the procedure.</u>
- 4. Refill the container with at least 16 ounces of clear liquid. Again, take your time and slowly finish all of it within 30 minutes. Finish drinking clear liquids at least 2 hours before the procedure. Do not take anything by mouth for at least 2 hours before the procedure.

Important:

- 1. You will need a driver to stay during your procedure and to drive you home afterward.
- 2. Avoid iron supplements for 1 week before the procedure.
- 3. If you take aspirin for heart protection, DO NOT stop taking it.
- 4. If you normally take medication in the morning for high blood pressure or seizures, please take it as usual at least 2 hours before the procedure.
- 5. So that appropriate adjustments can be made, please notify your doctor <u>at least one week</u> <u>before the procedure</u> if you take warfarin (Coumadin), Plavix, Eliquis, Xarelto, Pradaxa, or other blood thinners.
